- HonorHealth Scottsdale Shea Medical Center has made the difficult decision to close our pediatric intensive care unit.
- This is slated to happen on Thursday, Oct. 31, 2024, after which pediatric intensive care services will no longer be offered at HonorHealth Scottsdale Shea Medical Center. We will continue to offer general pediatric inpatient hospital care at this location.
- We remain committed to serving our community and providing exceptional, high-quality maternity and pediatric care.
- HonorHealth Scottsdale Shea Medical Center will continue to offer maternity and inpatient pediatric hospital care to our community, including high-risk obstetrics, in-house OB hospitalists, emergency services, eight licensed pediatric beds, robust post-delivery resources and a Level III NICU, which offers advanced care for newborns of any gestational age.
- HonorHealth Scottsdale Shea Medical Center will still offer care that's focused on providing our patients and their families a kid-friendly environment with an expert team that includes child life specialists, pediatric hospitalists and pediatric-trained nurses and physicians.
- Children will continue to have access to general pediatric treatments, including but not limited to, for respiratory issues including asthma, sepsis, and scorpion and snake bites.
